Year 11 Newsletter – September 2022

Welcome to the first Year 11 newsletter of 2022-23. I hope this newsletter finds you well and that your child has returned and settled back into the new academic year; their final one at Bristol Met. Firstly, for those who don't know, I am the Raising Attainment Lead for Year 11, and as such have a focus on outcomes and achievements for all students in the year group. My role involves working across all subjects and teams, particularly English and Maths, and communicating with parents and carers to ensure the best possible outcomes for the students in the summer of 2023. The year ahead:

Here is a very basic overview that has been shared with the students, of some of the key checkpoints across the coming academic year. Two very important checkpoints are the two mock windows. The first mock window will be taking place from Monday 31^{st} October, and the second mock window from Tuesday 21^{st} February. Mock exams:

Our first mock exam window is fast approaching. It will be a window of just over two weeks (the additional days will be used to accommodate more practical based subjects such as Art and Photography), starting on Monday 31st October. We will be working in assembly and tutor times to ensure all students have a revision plan in place and have tips and ideas on how to revise effectively.

The mocks will be formal, held in exam conditions in the same exam spaces that will be used in the summer exam series. It will be vital that both attendance to school, and punctuality in the mornings, is

Uniform:

When in the school building and moving through the school, students are expected to have their shirts tucked in and their blazers on.

Attendance:

Our year group attendance for last week (W/C 12th Sept) was 93.8%. Our target is 96%. If a student has an attendance of 95%, it will mean missing a total of 48 lessons in their final GCSE year. Please continue to encourage your child to attend school as much as possible, and to catch up on work missed where absence cannot be avoided.

Homework and Planners:

Homework is set differently at Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11), as it will be set by subject teachers and could include a range of activities. This might include exam answer practice, revision activities, research, coursework completion or other appropriate tasks to complement classroom learning. The homework set should be written into student planners with a clear deadline to help students to prioritise and manage their learning. This work is likely to be used within lessons and/or be collected for marking by the teacher so it is important for students to complete it on time. Where homework is not completed or handed in on time, we continue to have a graduated response system to address and improve this.

All students should now have received a planner which they are responsible for and are designed to develop independence within their learning. They should be carried with them to all lessons and used as a tool to organise their homework and revision throughout the year.

Careers and Post-16 guidance:

Here at Bristol Met we are extremely fortunate to have a dedicated careers guidance team, consisting of Tim Holmes and Bill Hayes. Your child will have already had some interaction with the team, and they are a familiar face in our weekly assemblies. The big focus now will of course be on the process of Post-16 applications.
