## Year 8 Term 1 Newsletter

#### Dear Parent/Carer

I wanted to extend a very warm welcome to you, as we return for a new year at Bristol Metropolitan Academy. I hope you are well at this time, and that your child has been enjoying their first term settling in at Bristol Met. I am writing to you to introduce myself as the Raising Attainment Lead for Year 8 this year and to explain this part of my role and my involvement in your child's education. My focus is on your child's achievement across all subjects and particularly in Maths and English, working with other staff and communicating with students and parents/carers to ensure that Year 8 students are getting the very most out of their first year here. I intend to communicate with you via a newsletter on a termly basis to keep you updated about important events and information that will help you to support your child.

#### Homework and Knowledge Organisers

All students should now have been given these two items which they are responsible for and are designed to develop independence. Knowledge organisers are a tool we use to support homework and contain key information for most subjects for that term. There are few expectations which include more practical subjects who will be setting homework separately. They will receive a new knowledge organiser each term which contains key information for every subject. This is to be written in their homework book, following the two-week timetable and with the layout shown in there. Homework completion will be checked daily by tutors and where not completed, we have a graduated response system to address and improve this with students. The knowledge organiser also has space for the students' lesson timetable to be added as I know a few have lost the loose pieces of paper. There is also an additional reading log to record and reflect on what they have been reading at home each week.

#### Reading and subject Assessments

Year 8 will already have completed a reading assessment at the start of term. We monitor reading ages in all KS3 students across the academy to ensure we have the right support in place where appropriate. Reading assessments take place three times across the year; September, January and June. It is important students engage with these assessments so that we get the most accurate data possible. Students will also complete formal subject assessments in Term 3. These assessments will take place in their normal lessons and will be in different formats depending upon the subject. Students will be prepared for assessments by their class teachers, and I will do some work with them in assemblies about how to prepare for assessments as well as being mindful of their wellbeing and ensuring we look at issues around stress and how to manage this too. I will update you and them about this in my next newsletter, please don't worry about this for now. It's just so you know assessments do happen and when.

## Tutor Contact and Tutor Evening

Tutor evening is Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> October, and this will give you the opportunity to speak with your child's tutor and discuss how they have settled in and ask any questions you need to. The evening will be virtual for Yr 8 as you only need to make one appointment. More information will follow on how to book this shortly. #### <u>Attendance</u>

One of the key areas we as a school want to focus on together is attendance to school. We have an Academy aim of all students having 96% attendance or above. Yr 8 currently have an overall attendance of 94.8% so slightly lower than we'd like. Please ensure child is in every day unless there are exceptional reasons. Please do contact us to let us know reasons for any absence on the morning of every absence.
