Next steps

On Results Day we spoke to many of you about the importance of securing your place with a Post 16 provider:

- If you applied for and received a conditional or unconditional place with a Post 16 provider before Results Day, the offer made to you should be honoured. Therefore, you should have received information from your chosen Post 16 provider outlining your start date, induction day requirements and course details. If not, do get in touch with them to gather this information and inform them of your GCSE grades
- If you are yet to secure a place with a Post 16 provider, conduct some research online to find out about what each provider offers and then contact selected providers to enquire about places available. Opportunity to sit GCSE exams this autumn

On 30th June, Ofqual confirmed that any student unable to receive a centre assessment grade or calculated result, and others who would like to improve their grades, will have an opportunity to take the full suite of GCSE, AS and A-level exams in the autumn term. Autumn exams (collectively known as the November series), will take place **at Bristol Metropolitan Academy between Monday 2**nd **November to Monday 23**rd **November, 2020.**

If you wish to take any GCSE exams this autumn for any of the reasons outlined above, **please contact our Exams Officer** (<u>Mandie.Armstrong@clf.uk</u>) **by or before Monday 14**th **September**, providing the following information:

- Your full name
- The subject(s) you wish to sit GCSE exams for
- The reason(s) you wish to sit these exams

Once you have provided this information and the autumn examination schedule has been confirmed, our Exams Officer will be in touch with further details.

What to do if you have concerns or questions about your GCSE grades

If you have concerns or questions about any of your GCSE grades, it's important that you are aware and have access to the following official information:
