Dear Parent/Carers,

In what is likely the final update from me before the end of the year I wanted to say Thank You for all of your continued support this year. Whilst Covid now feels a distance behind us in terms of disruption I fully recognise that the national industrial action over the last 6 months has caused disruption to the continuity of education for our students. I hope that last week's announcement by the Government around additional funding injections for schools may mean we are going to see a year ahead of some form of "normal".

Unfortunately the Inflatables Rewards Day planned for today has not been able to go ahead due to the weather but has been rearranged for 11th September.

We have a normal final week of term up until Friday. Friday morning will see normal lessons interspersed with the usual end of term Celebration Assembly for each year group. Students will then finish at lunchtime (12:40pm) on Friday 21st July. A grab and go lunch will be available for any students needing it and then students will leave site.

Last week was a very busy week of events for our students. Monday was Sports Day rebooted with a new format to encourage even wider participation. Despite a dubious forecast we made it to only 30 minutes before the end of the planned programme before rain stopped play. Well done to Performance Panthers House who took the trophy when all events were collated. Tuesday evening saw 'Met Fest', a wonderful music concert held in our main atrium (weather stopped it being the intended outdoor showcase). Wednesday evening saw the art department offer a showcase of student work at 'Sparks Bristol'; a repurposing of the old Marks & Spencers store in Broadmead. Finally, across Thursday and Friday Year 7 and Year 8 Met Mastery students performed 'High School the Musical' to a number of audiences. All of the events were a real credit to the students and the staff who provide the opportunities and I know that students appreciated all of the events.

As we head to the final days of term below are a few updates and messages both from the Academy and some wider partners:

Airbus – many families will have heard of the 'Airbus Programme' that has been running at Bristol Met across the last 6 years. We have been incredibly fortunate to have had this relationship for so long. Originally it was meant to be for one year with Airbus planning to rotate to a new school each year. They enjoyed their time with us so much that they extended another year (and then another). However, like many good things, the time has come for it to end and Airbus have decided that they really must move on to another school. Whilst we are sad to lose the programme we fully understand why Airbus must move on. We know that students in current Y7 & Y8 may have been looking forward to their opportunity to apply for a place on the programme and we are sorry to be bringing this news. We are however talking to some other exciting partners and if we can find a replacement programme we will communicate details of this as soon as we can.

Fencing – last weekend saw the final Fencing tournament of the year. It's always a hotly contested battle between Bristol Met competitors and White Eagle Fencing Club. Marnie took Bronze in U14. Eli took Bronze in U16 in his first tournament. Well done also to Mae, Toby, Darya, Aayan and Rafael for competing. A massive Thank You to Mr Cooley for all of his work on Fencing over his time at Bristol Met. Mr Cooley is retiring at the end of this term so it is somewhat the end of an era. A sizable number of students have had the opportunity to experience fencing at Bristol Met in the last





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15 years owing completely to Mr Cooley. We have been exploring options to try and ensure the legacy of fencing can continue at Bristol Met in the future and will update when we can.

Lockers – across these final few days of term please ensure that any items in lockers are removed and brought home safely for the Summer. As part of our contract with Skanska they will empty and clean **every** locker and they will remove any items inside. We cannot guarantee that any items left will be reunited in September so please do ensure everything is removed before Friday. All lockers will also have new key locks fitted over the summer which will mean reliable locks and fast issue in September. There are enough lockers for every individual student so in the first two weeks of September every student who pays a key deposit will be able to have their own individual lockers for safe storage of items for the rest of the year.
