Dear Parent/Carer,

Today is the official middle of this term! With such a short, but busy, term the time is truly flying by. Although I sit writing this on a rather dreary day of weather the week to follow looks much brighter. We have been enjoying having the field back open on the nicer days and it has been lovely seeing the majority of students spending their social times outside in the fresh air. There is a message below from our catering providers and then various 'nice news' stories from the first few weeks of term.

Canteen Prices – firstly, an apology from us on behalf of Aspens (the onsite catering providers) for this not being communicated in advance of the changes being implemented as I know it has caused some confusion for our families. A recent change in the Aspens management personnel meant this fell through the gaps in communication. We have met with the area manager to discuss a system to ensure this does not happen in future. With regret Aspens have had no alternative but to increase the prices of some of the food items that are on sale during the mid-morning break periods. Aspens have been holding off price rises for as long as possible however due to the increased costs of food items/ingredients as well as transport and labour increases, they are unable to sustain this any longer. Please be assured that the price of a main meal deal will remain at £2.40 which we believe does offer good value for money still. The current Aspen's Price List can be found here. Aspen's have committed to ensuring that any potential future price increases are communicated in advance so that we can let our families know.

Culture Day – on Friday this week (13th May) BMA are hosting our "Culture Day". This has been organised in its entirety by our Student Leaders (supported by Mr Cooley and a few other staff) who were very keen in their election manifesto to celebrate and highlight cultural backgrounds shared by the students and staff at Bristol Met. They hope to make a success of Friday and grow the event to feature involvement of families in the future. For Friday there will be 'Cultural Dress Day', live performances from students at social time, a varied menu in the canteen and a number of different themes that will be interviewed into normal lessons. For the cultural dress it is essentially a non-uniform day but with the encouragement to wear something that you think represents your own culture or identity. The student leaders have deliberately tried to keep this a broad definition that can be interpreted in any way that students feel comfortable (traditional outfits, sports clothing etc). As always with non-uniform, we do ask students to ensure that what they wear allows them to participate fully in their learning for the day. We are asking for the usual £1 voluntary donation to charity where able.
