Welcome to the **Cabot Learning** Federation (CLF)

Our Federation consists of over 20 academies in Bristol. South Gloucestershire and North Somerset: eight secondary and nine primary academies; one all-through academy; overarching Post 16 provision; a Studio School; and a suite of alternative provisions. Together we educate over 12,500 children between the ages of 3 and 19 and the Federation enjoys steady growth.

We are proud that every CLF academy has shown marked improvement, as identified by Ofsted and pupils' outcomes. Our work is changing the educational landscape across the region; in the Federation we believe that pupils come first and that every child can find a route to happiness, prosperity and success.



The Federation was created to enable staff to work more closely together to deliver the best education possible for the students who attend our academies. We are proud of the improvements we have seen in pupil outcomes and more of our students than ever before have qualifications that compare favourably with other young people across the South West. This has enabled us to develop a Federation Sixth Form, with over 800 students staving in full time education after their GCSE courses have finished in Bristol, South Gloucestershire and North Somerset.

As a partner in the Five Counties Teaching School Hubs Alliance, as a Behaviour Hub and as a National Maths Hub, we are at the heart of a network of over 900 schools across our region. We also have School Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT), which means we train and accredit our own teachers, recruiting the best people into the profession and supporting them throughout their careers.

High **Aspirations**

Our Academy is a centre of excellence within our community.

Local primary schools bring their students to us to share in the use of our facilities and to benefit from our expert specialist teaching in Science, Technology and Modern Foreign Languages.

We work alongside our Primary partners and across the Cabot Learning Federation to share staff training and to ensure that we provide the best experiences for our local community. Our partnerships with local business leaders have afforded our students opportunities for work experience, mock interviews, job shadowing and mentoring. In addition, all students are provided with opportunities to learn beyond the school environment in the form of trips and visits over the course of the academic year.

High Expectations

We are defined by a culture of participation. Our students get involved in a broad range of activities before, during and after the school day as well as gaining valuable workbased and further study skills.

From the free breakfast club at the start of the day, to the after school opportunities in sport, performing arts and independent study, students are keen to join in with new activities, to support one another and most of all to have fun. A recent visitor to the Academy noted:

It is a breath of fresh air to see so many students able and encouraged to take part in any sport of their choosing. It is fantastic to see students -

being competitive and pushing themselves to be the best they can."

Current opportunities include football, basketball, cricket, netball, trampolining, cheer, fencing, sailing, dance workshops, drama, debating, music production, band club, coding, DT and art club, as well as opportunities to complete homework and revise with teachers after school. In Key Stage 3, years 7 and 8, there is also a timetabled enrichment session in which students are able to choose to pursue an interest or learn a new skill which wouldn't normally be accessible during curriculum time.

In addition, over the course of the year students are given numerous opportunities to share their skills and talents with their peers and visitors, from concerts, musicals and talent shows, to sporting displays, demonstrations, and competitions, all characterised by a large crowd of supportive students and a desire to create, celebrate, participate and have fun

A Sense of **Belonging**

Beyond bricks and mortar, it is the ethos at Bristol Metropolitan Academy that makes it a safe, purposeful and happy place to learn. All students belong to a 'Tutor Group' overseen by a House Team. Every day starts with contact time with that key staff member. In addition there is a Student Support Base and a Learning Support Base where students who need additional support can take part in small group and one to one work. Our innovative intervention suite, The Hub, is used by students of all ages and ability levels to receive coaching and additional tuition in English and Maths.

Our staff teams are considered by students to be reliable, trustworthy and knowledgeable. When Ofsted visited the Academy in March 2022, they said that "there is a harmonious learning environment across the school. Pupils behave well both in lessons and around the school. Staff address bullying when it occurs. Pupils state that if they have a concern, they can go to a range of adults for help. They feel safe and cared for by staff."



Our **Journey**

Since opening in 2009 the Academy has been on a journey of continuous improvement seeking to provide the highest quality of education to all of its students.

In 2019 we secured 2nd place in the city for the progress made by students at Bristol Met. The following 2 years of a global pandemic caused upheaval to education for all young people, but when exams returned in Summer 2022 we were delighted to retain the 2nd spot in the city and we now have our sights set firmly on 1st place. Our exceptional achievements are now not just a case of a single year of great results, but a consistent picture.

When Ofsted visited the Academy in March 2022 we were recognised as ensuring that all students receive a good quality of education: "Pupils, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), receive a good quality of education at Bristol Metropolitan Academy."

State-of-the-Art Facilities

Bristol Metropolitan Academy is housed within a modern, purpose-built award-winning building centred around a 'street' - a vast, open thoroughfare used for gatherings, celebrations and social time.

You will find:

- O Both domestic and professional-standard kitchens for student use
- An array of industry-standard tools for use in design and technology, including computer-aided design
- A mirrored expressive arts studio with sprung wooden flooring
- A large sports hall and smaller gym

- Several ICT suites and a Mac suite designed specifically for video and audio editing
- A recording studio and practice rooms equipped with a variety of instruments and facilities
- A number of science laboratories
- Outside all-weather pitch, sports field, cricket nets and multi-use games area as well as other social spaces.
- Students are able to ride bicycles and scooters to school, storing them within locked storage facilities, and every student has access to a locker within the building for safe storage of their school work, kit and personal possessions.
