**RE: Snowdon Road - Safer Routes to School Pedestrian & Cycling Improvement Proposals**

The planning conditions associated with the redevelopment of the former Blackberry Hill Hospital included funding to provide "Safer Routes to School" highway improvements in the vicinity of Bristol Metropolitan Academy.

Bristol City Council would like to invite you to comment on the proposals for the use of that funding. The proposals shown on the enclosed drawing focus on improving pedestrian facilities in the vicinity of the school by providing a zebra crossing, dropped kerbs and wider footways. Bus stop accessibility improvements are also proposed, which include a raised bus stop and new path to the bus stop (subject to bus services operating on this route). Additional tree planting may also be possible.

The length of Snowdon Road on the eastern side of the triangle green outside number 80 & 82 is proposed to be closed to motorised through traffic. This will reduce the number of vehicle movements in the vicinity of the proposed Zebra crossing and also reduce conflict on this narrow section of road at busy times.
